



A wonderful area to explore, stunning views and the chance to see salt mining elephants.



Mt Elgon Elephant Project (MEEP) is a private organization promoting the importance of the preservation of the Forest Reserves surrounding Mt Elgon National Park. The reserves have numerous caves used by the elephants and other wildlife. Generations of elephant have migrated to and from the reserves to the park. The forest habitat is imperative for the survival of the salt mining elephants. The MEEP team comprising members of the local community, is currently collecting data on the elephants using modern electronic equipment and undertaking forestry analysis.

# Visit Mount Elgon



An opportunity to walk through natural forests to see Elephant, Buffalo, Waterbuck, Bushbuck, Giant Forest Hog, Red Duiker, Grey Duiker, Suni, Blue Monkey, Colobus Monkey and wonderful birdlife.

The ancient volcano of Mt Elgon lies on the Kenya-Uganda border. The region is heavily forested with numerous caves, once inhabited by the Elgon Masai and Ndorobo people, and now regularly visited by elephants and other animals for mineral salts. The caves also contain evidence of stone-age use.



Untamed Wilderness. Secluded Splendour. Visitors can explore the forest, caves and enjoy the peace of this ancient volcano.

Learn about the elephant migration routes from the Forest Reserves to the Mt Elgon Park.

The slopes of the mountain are covered with tall podocarpus and juniper trees with bamboo higher up the slopes. Giant groundsel, lobelia and helichrysum attract many unique birds and insects. There are over 140 bird species, from birds of prey to brilliantly coloured turaco and sunbirds.
